Abstract

Government policies that aim to overcome poverty by promoting sustainable development globally are the goals of development policies. From a bibliometric analysis, this study aims to visually research mapping and research trends in the field of development policy in ASEAN. This study used bibliometric techniques with secondary data from Scopus. Analyze and visualize data using the VOSViewer program and the analyze search results function on Scopus. This study analyzed 508 scientific documents published from 1965 to 2019. According to the research, Indonesia, the National University of Singapore, and Hill, H. had the most active county, affiliated institutions, and individual scientists in Development Policy in ASEAN research. Social Sciences; and IOP Conference Series Earth and Environmental Science were the most studied and disseminated outlets of development policy research in ASEAN. There was two category map of collaborative researchers. Based on the identification of a collection of knowledge generated from over fifty-four years of publication, this research proposes a grouping of development policy research themes: People, Environment, Government, and Sustainable policy, abbreviated as the PEGS research themes.
